Top 10 Tips of PPD Evaluation

- 1. Presentations: Five types = Demonstration, Illustrated Talk, Speech, Recitation, and Dramatic Interpretation. Cloverbuds are their own type.
- 2. Team Presenters: Only two options allowed= Demonstration and Dramatic Interpretation.
- Time: 5 minute minimum, 15 minute max (A Cloverbud has no set time to meet) – Record time on score sheet. Presentation experience should= longer presentation.
- 4. Forms: Make sure they are completed top to bottom. Comments need to reinforce "good job" and constructive feedback.
- Scoring: Must be within 1 point of co-evaluator. If a 3 or less is given you
 must explain why. If presenter is in special attire automatically give a 5 for
 appearance.
- 6. Parts: Presentation should have Introduction, Body, and Conclusion.
- Set-up: No adult help (unless requested). Presenter should be able to set-up all technical equipment on their own. Cloverbuds can have assistance if necessary.
- Food Presentation: Look for proper set up= clean side vs dirty, works from side to side to not contaminate clean, no commercial labels, proper food safety, trash bag, clean hands or gloves. See Document for all rules.
- 9. References: Presenter must cite at least 1 reliable source.
- 10. Questions: Need to make sure at least 2 questions are asked. Presenter must answer by first restating the question.
