

# YOUTH DEVELOPMENT BUILDING (YDB) EVALUATION DAY FAQS







You will check in and be given an envelope with your printed project/exhibit entry tickets inside. You will then be directed to the staging/set up area where you can unpack your items and match them to the entry tickets. You will then take the project, the entry ticket and find the evaluation spot for your item. You will briefly meet with an Evaluator who will evaluate your project/exhibit. Once all of your projects have been evaluated, you will hand your envelope back in and you are free to leave.

#### Q: What should I do if I cannot bring my 4-H Youth Development Building entry to be evaluated?

**A:** You can have another person bring your entries if absolutely necessary. The 4-H Office strongly urges you to bring in your own entries because evaluators are able to offer constructive comments on the quality of your work. As noted, if not present, the exhibitor MUST answer questions about the entry on an accompanying 3" x 5" index card for quality.

#### SPECIAL REQUIREMENT FOR 4-H EXHIBITORS NOT TALKING WITH FAIR EVALUATOR

For any 4-H member who is unable to bring his/her exhibits/entries to the 4-H Youth Development Building on Saturday, August 3, 2024, to speak personally with the evaluator, the following Exhibitor Information Statement is *required* to be completed for *each* exhibit/entry. The evaluator will require this in order to accept the exhibit/entry. (Cloverbuds should complete this information to the best of their abilities; 4-H'ers should complete these statements fully in their own handwriting, if possible. Age and experience will be taken into consideration.)

1. What is the Kind	<b>I</b> and <i>Variety</i>	<b>y</b> of your exhibit (relates to vegetables, flowers, e	etc.)
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- 2. Describe what you did to complete this project. Provide a list of materials, products and/or equipment used and why they were selected. Briefly explain your methods of construction process and your source of ideas (3-5 sentences is sufficient).
- 3. In approximately 3-5 sentences, describe your feelings about this project: what you learned, what challenged you, and /or how you would improve your exhibit in the future.
- 4. Additional information requested in the Section for this class (Be sure to read complete guidelines in each section)
- 5. Additional information or special needs to be noted by the evaluator.

#### Q: Is it okay to put information on notebook paper or on a 4" x 6" index card instead of a 3" x 5" index card?

**A:** Yes, another sized paper may be substituted for the 3"x5" index card. The answers should be in the child's own words and handwriting when possible. Recipes may be photocopied.

#### Q: What happens if I enter an item in the wrong class?

**A:** The evaluator will ask you to have it corrected through the person in charge of entries, and the entry will then be evaluated but the premium will be reduced.

#### Q: When and where do I pick up my premium check?

A: All premium checks (livestock & 4-H Youth Development Building exhibits) will be mailed to the exhibitor this year. All checks must be cashed within 60 days of the check date, or they will be forfeited to the Erie County Agricultural Society that time

### Q: When do I pick up my 4-H Youth Development Building Entry, and what happens if I am unable to be there?

A: It is very important that <u>all</u> projects in the Youth Development Building get picked up on MONDAY, August 19 between 3-6pm. If the 4-Her/family is not available to pick-up projects, you <u>must</u> send a representative (4-H club leader, friend, relative, etc.) to pick up your projects. Projects that are not picked up are left in a building that is not secure and we wouldn't want anything to happen to your wonderful projects. Families should not arrive until 3pm unless an email is sent out stating that pick-up can be done earlier.

### **2024 Erie County Fair Ticket Information:**

### 4-H Youth Development Building

Tickets are a gift from the fair. We are given a limited number of tickets.

Signing up to volunteer ahead of time helps us to anticipate the number of tickets we will need. This is one hour of volunteering that helps allow us to continue to have a well-run building to display our 4-Her's hard work.

- 4-H member ages 13 and older Once a 4-H member successfully delivers their entries to the Youth Development Building on August 3, they will be given three 3 admission/exhibitor tickets to the fair. (This is in line with the Fair's Junior Exhibitor Ages 13-17 policy)
- 4-H members who are 12 and under enter the fair for free. \*If a 4-H member, age 5-12, is participating in a Public Interaction event, they may receive 1 ticket so that an adult can enter the fair and accompany them to their event.
- Public Interaction Entries/Activities\* -A 4-H member (regardless of age) will receive an additional ticket for each day they have signed up for an event in the Youth Development Building. Events include, but are not limited to, 4-H Café, Ambassador, Fashion Show, etc. 4-H members will only receive these additional tickets once they have signed up, either online or in-person, for a time slot (if appliable) for their event.
- Work Nights -4-H youth and adults that volunteered their time at a work night may receive at least one ticket (if you attend multiple work nights, please check-in with Maddie if you'd like additional tickets)

All bidders will need to check in each auction day at the customer service location for the auction services.

**Processors:** Please note that Falconers and M&M Meats (SK Meats) will NOT be on our list. I have 2 other processors on hold to add last minute if they have slots available after they have received Wyoming County 4-H Market animals. Both processors are in Wyoming county.

Market Brochures will be sent to all members who have entered to participate in the fair on July 12. Each member will receive five brochures. If you need more, you will need to contact the 4-H office or myself to request them and schedule a pickup time. We are not able to mail extra brochures. If you want them mailed, you will need to pay for the postage. I will also have extra available at livestock interviews.

2024 4-H Fair Theme: "Carnival Fun"

**Emails:** Please be sure to check your email regularly for email updates pertaining to the fair. Email is our best way to communicate with everyone as it is fast and efficient.

**Help Needed:** Our 4-H Livestock office will be moving to the fair on Thursday, August 1 after lunch and we could use some help in moving. If we have a couple members (great community service) available from 1-5 pm that day please let Tammi know at tlk6@cornell.edu as soon as possible. We will start at the 4-H office and finish at the Showplex office.

Dorms: The dorms will be closed for the 2023 fair.

**Health Papers:** I am hopeful that everyone has health papers or an appointment to have them done soon. Remember no health paper = no admission for your animal to the fair or show. Animals that receive a rabies vaccination and/or a shipping fever vaccination, remember have a 21-day withholding.

Health Check in at the Fair: No animals are to be unloaded from a trailer until they have been inspected by the NYS Veterinarian. Upon arrival the gate person will direct you to the vet check in station for your species. They will do their absolute best to get your animals inspected so you can get them off the trailer. How can you help? #1 your health paper should be in the vehicle that is pulling the trailer. #2 be prepared to handle your animals to bring them to the back of the trailer for the veterinarian to see the ear tags and animal. By being prepared check-in will go smoothly and efficiently. Reminder, if you have cattle showing signs of warts, make sure you remove them. Lambs and goats showing signs of sore mouth should always stay home.

**Livestock Interviews:** We have completed 2 evenings of Livestock Interviews; This year we have many evaluators that are public presentation judges. So far our evaluators have been impressed with everyone's knowledge and ease of sharing your information about your animals. I look forward to our 2 biggest evenings on July 18 and 31. July 18 participants have received the email with all the details, July 31 participants will receive the information by July 19.

**Livestock t-shirts:** Each livestock participant will receive a 2024 4-H Fair t-shirt. Please watch your email within the next week for a request to verify your size and please be prompt in responding. Thank you.

Livestock t-shirt design: Do you have a design to share? I will need it by Monday, July 15.

**Beef:** Our last beef meeting will be Fitting & Showmanship on Tuesday, July 23 at 6:00 pm at the Mesch's beef barn, 14162 DuPont Road, Collins 14034. We will be doing a refresher on fitting and showmanship. We look forward to seeing you all at this meeting.

**Sheep:** We held our **Sheep Fitting and Showing** meeting on Tuesday, July 2 at Vergien's. Thank you to Ava, Addison and Kendall Vergien and Corrin Sacilowski for sharing your knowledge about show ring preparation and showmanship techniques.

**Swine:** The Swine program will not be providing shavings for you this year, you must bring your own bedding for your hog pens. Plan to have enough so you can clean your pen every day. I have ordered shavings from Clyde's Feed, and they will be available for you to PURCHASE from the program at the fair. I am waiting on the price. If you purchase from 4-H, please be sure to pay at the 4-H Showplex office before you take any.

All hog pens must have a tube waterer, no pan watering will be allowed. We have 29 tube waterers, each family will receive one – if you want more, please be sure to bring your own from home. We will also have feeders available for members to use.

**Goats:** We held our Goat Fitting and Showing meeting on June 27 at the Saraceni/Hayne family farm. Thank you to Charlotte S. and Analise H. along with Aidan Dobson for a great educational presentation on showmanship and fitting techniques. Thank you to Mary Palka for putting the knowledge contest together also.

**Dogs:** Dog project registration paperwork if you have not submitted your current rabies certificate and dog license you must do so prior to the fair if you are planning to participate with your dog in the show.

**Poultry:** Our poultry show will take place at the Blair Farm, 3060 Bullis Road, Elma, on Sunday, July 28, 2024, at 4 p.m. Please mark your calendars for this important date. We will be evaluating all market chickens and turkeys. Each member selling in the auction should bring 4 chickens and 2 turkeys. The extra 2 chickens and 1 extra turkey will be donated to FeedMore WNY as your community service project.

Washing your market poultry projects – please be sure to bring clean birds to the show on July 28. At our last meeting Mr. Weber suggested NOT washing your birds you will be selling. It is important that your birds are clean for our judge to handle. To prevent bruising and broken wings, clean your birds with a cloth and warm soap and water and wipe the birds instead of putting in a tank of water. Start now to get the birds cleaned, keep their pens clean and dry. I encourage you to bring 1 bird per family that has been washed in the traditional way to use for showmanship. Remember in showmanship you will want to brush up on proper holding, parts of the bird, cuts of chicken, care, feed and some general knowledge about the industry itself.

The poultry show will be very busy this year. Be prepared to participate in showmanship, have your birds evaluated and also do the knowledge contest while you are waiting. Pictures for the auction will begin at 5 pm. Remember to bring a chair if you wish to sit.

Upon your arrival you will have your birds weighed. Roasters and broilers will be determined by the weight of the birds. Please be sure to have some way to contain your birds on top of the crates while the judge is evaluating. Turkeys should be in a crate that is large enough to keep them comfortable. No birds should be loaded onto the trailer until the show is completed. We will all work together, and I look forward to a great show.

**Rabbit** All rabbit participants should bring a 2x2 piece of carpeting to use at the judging table.

Our last rabbit meeting will be taking place on Monday, July 15 at 6 pm at the Power House. We will be discussing the fair and answering questions. We do ask for members to help in the rabbit barn during the fair to allow for interaction and some make and takes for the fair guests.

Please be sure your rabbits are free from sniffles, wet tail and mites when you bring them to the fair. The superintendent will do an inspection and animals that are unhealthy will be sent home.

Meat Rabbit participants, your auction will be Saturday, August 10 at 6 p.m. The order of the sale will be Chickens, Rabbits, Turkeys.

The NY Hunter Education course (Hunter Safety course) is required to purchase a hunting license in New York. The course covers the necessary safety techniques and responsibilities that a hunter must know when using a gun, muzzleloader, crossbow, or bow to pursue wild game.


