

2024 Erie County Fair Schedule and Fair Book: Be sure to check out the livestock sections of the 2024 Erie County Fair book that have been posted to the fair website. Check out the sections under competitions. Be sure to read all the rules and regulations so you are prepared for the fair. If you would like to see the livestock schedule you can see that in the same tab. Be sure to check the date in the lower right corner to be sure you are looking at the most up-to-date schedule as we have moved a couple of things around.

Market participants in the Beef, Sheep, Swine, Poultry, Rabbit, and Goat programs: Please be sure to read important meeting information at the beginning of the livestock notes and RSVP to participate in the Livestock Roundup Dinner. Those members that attended all 3 Marketing workshops will only have to participate in 1 species specific meeting (for each species), public presentation, and the livestock interview to be eligible to show and sell. We encourage you to participate in more learning opportunities, but we also value the time you spent adding tools to your toolbox to secure bidders. Members that did not attend all 3 marketing workshops are required to participate in 2 species specific meetings along with a public presentation and the livestock interview.

Beef: Thank you to the beef members who either submitted a video of you walking your steer on a rope halter or submitted a signed form. If you did not do either, you will be hearing from me shortly. Remember, your show halter and show stick video or form is due to the office by Monday, June 3. Keep working with your calves on the halter and by August, they will follow you and do what ever you ask of them.

Swine: Swine Orientation was held on Monday, March 4, 2024, we reviewed the program along with feeds, cuts and equipment. Thank you to Mr. Hayes for speaking to our members about what to do with your pigs when you get them home to get off to a good start for a successful project. Remember, your hogs are most likely coming out of a barn that was heated, keep them warm by providing a heat source or extra bedding. Pay attention to the temperature when you are bringing them home – keep them warm.

Sheep: Sheep Orientation will be held on Monday, March 11, 2024, at 6:30 pm at the Powerhouse, 39 S. Grove Street, East Aurora. We will be reviewing the program and doing a hands-on activity.

Sheep and Meat Goat members: Saratoga County is hosting a Champion Choice Camp on Sunday, May 19th in the Ballston Spa area. This camp is a Nationally recognized camp that focuses on taking kids to the next level in the show ring and in preparing their animals for show. Youth bring their own animals and learn everything from teaching the brace, showmanship techniques in the ring, desensitizing their animals, nutrition and fitting of their animal. The camp is for youth interested in Meat Goats and Sheep. Each youth should bring their own animal with them. Registration space is limited. Cost is \$150.00 per species, register at https://www.championschoicecamps.com/ If you participate and submit a report, you will earn a meeting credit. I have heard wonderful reviews about this program.

Poultry: We held our first poultry meeting on Tuesday, February 20. We collected the market chicken and turkey orders. Every year New York requests a certain number of delegates to host and works to find host families for those delegates within the 4-H population. Delegates range in age from 12-18 (most are 12-14) and do not speak much English. Traveling and staying with an American family is about the full immersion of the delegate into American Culture. Therefore, the host family must have a child of the same age and gender as the arriving delegate.
