


4-H Celebration and Food in Community Harvest Festival!

Re-Enrollment

Please make sure you get your re-enrollment forms and payment to the 4-H office by November 1, 2024. If you are in a club, your leader should have received your pre-filled re-enrollment forms. Individual Members should have their re-enrollment forms at Erie County Fair Entry Day in August or mailed to you in September. Make corrections as needed and be sure to get them to the 4-H office timely. Do not submit without payment as you are not enrolled until payment is made. If the enrollment fee is a financial hardship for your family simply as for it to be waived.



October 2024 - Livestock Notes

A new year, new beginnings, new learning, more fun and the opportunity to challenge yourself all while learning by doing. I am excited to see what this project year will bring for each of you.

Premium Checks: Last reminder, did you cash your premium check? If you have not, be sure to get it done within 60 days of the date at the top, or your premiums will be donated back to the fair.

Market Checks: Everyone who sold animals in the 2024 auction, should have received your market check by now. Please be sure to cash them promptly. Any checks that are misplaced or lost, that need to be reissued, will have a fee added to them. Please get your checks cashed by November 1.

Buyers: If you need information pertaining to your buyer(s) please email me and I will provide you with the information.

Award Sponsors: On the back of the letter you received with your market check you will find the names and addresses of our auctioneers, please be sure to send them a thank you note for their continued support to the program. There was also a label at the bottom with the name of a sponsor, please send a thank you note to that business/person as their financial support made the t-shirt you received possible.

Re-enrollment forms for the 2024-2025 program year will be due on November 1 for all returning members. Please be sure to include your payment with the enrollment forms as you are not officially enrolled until payment is made. Why should you enroll early – SO YOU GET THE 4-H NEWS and can stay up to date with everything that is being offered. If the enrollment fee is a financial hardship, simply ask for it to be waived. Ren-enrollment forms are available in the 4-H office, the Food and Community Festival on Sept 20 or if space permits with your market check.

Email Addresses: Please be sure to write on your enrollment form the email addresses that you would like correspondence sent to. Email is our main line of communication. If you wish for your 4-H member to receive emails, be sure to write the address on the form. Please write neatly and clearly so we get the address correct.

Beef Orientation will be held on November 4 at 6:30 p.m. at the Power House, 39 S. Grove Street, East Aurora 14052. We will have some exciting changes to the beef program for the coming year and all the details will be shared at the orientation. We will also have a presentation with a hands-on activity and an overview of the program with expectations of the beef project. A meeting you surely will not want to miss. I will also have all the beef halters from your 2024 project.

Who went to the Harvest Classic? If you participated remember to submit a short report about what you learned to receive a meeting credit.

Dairy Cattle Orientation will be held on December 9 at 6:30 p.m. at the Power House, 39 S. Grove Street, East Aurora 14052. We will be making Mozzarella Cheese and going over the goals and objectives of the program and planning out some meeting topics.

Western District Dairy Bowl will be held on Saturday, March 1, 2025 at Pioneer school.

Goat Orientation will be held on December 16 at 6:30 p.m. at the Power House, 39 S. Grove Street, East Aurora 14052. Our orientation will kick off the new year and we will share changes to the program and have a fun activity.

Sheep and Swine – while we currently do not have any meetings to schedule, now is a great time to begin to think about your public presentation, remember those will be here come February. Remember to get your 2025 enrollment paperwork and fee into the 4-H office by November 1.

Poultry—Stay tuned for information coming about our poultry meetings that will begin in January.

Rabbit – We will hold our first rabbit club meeting in November, This meeting will focus on future meeting topics, location, and day to hold meetings. Reminder: be sure to get your re-enrollment paperwork and payment to the 4-H office by November 1.

Dog - Our clubs are both accepting new members between the ages of 5-18. The Ridge Rovers meet in Orchard Park and the Buffalo Barkers meet in Tonawanda. Here is a really cool opportunity for you to participate in if you are interested. Open to 4-H members between the ages of 8-18 - Junior Agility class at PREMIER DOG SPORTS, with Instructor - Darcy Ferrentino. The course is 6 weeks, and the cost is \$100 for 4-H members. Interested 4-H members please let the Erie County 4-H Office know if you would like to apply.


