It's Public Presentation Season!

What are 4-H Public Presentations? 4-H Public Presentation Days are a time when youth can practice their public speaking skills and gain confidence through positive encouragement. Youth that show livestock at the fair are required to complete a public presentation. All Erie County 4-H members are invited and encouraged to sign-up and participate in Public Presentations, regardless of club/independent member status or age.

All first- and second-year presenters are encouraged to do a presentation that has a poster. Learning the basics of a presentation in the first couple years will make an excellent presenter in the future. We remind our older youth who want to do a computer-based presentation to be comfortable with setting up your electronic devices without the assistance of an adult, and to feel confident when using your device to present.

We are looking for 4-H members who would like to learn more about **public presentations** while gaining *community service hours* that can be used for school or other requirements. There are a couple of roles you can fill during any of our Public Presentation Days:

- **Runner**- Carry public presentations evaluation forms from presentation rooms to the tally room (you don't actually need to "run")
- **Junior Evaluator**- Sit with evaluators and learn what they are looking for to give out "5"'s to a presenter. This may help you learn what to work on for your own presentation! This is also a great way to meet and interact with fellow 4-Hers while learning about some cool topics.
- **Junior Room Host**- Introduce a presenter to their audience and their evaluators

Youth are welcome to volunteer for a couple of hours (when they aren't giving their presentation) on the same day that they sign up to present. Youth are also welcome to sign up to help on a day that they are not presenting.

What is peer evaluation?

- Peer evaluation is the opportunity for youth to observe and evaluate each other by giving presentations and providing feedback within their group.

How does it work?

- You will be in a room with three other 4-H members. All four 4-Hers (yourself included) will give their presentation to each other.
- You will complete a brief evaluation form for each presentation that you will share with your peers giving each other feedback.
- Two adult evaluators will also be in the room who will share verbal feedback and complete the regular rubric, then give you a point score to decide your ribbon color.
- This whole experience will take approximately two hours.
- There will be a required, brief pre-event virtual orientation to help you feel prepared.

Why participate?

- Get feedback directly from fellow 4-H peers, in addition to adult evaluators.
- Gain experience in evaluating and giving feedback.
- Get community service hours – since you'll be benefiting other 4-H members through your feedback, participating in this format can count toward school service hours.

How do I sign up?

On the Public Presentation registration page to select **Peer Evaluation** for either Saturdays of 4-H Public Presentation Days (Feb 7th or 21st). The 4-H Office will follow up with you to confirm the time block of your group.



Learn about the hemlock woolly adelgid with CCE staff and a local Master Gardener volunteer on January 31, 2026, and about how you can become a citizen scientist that helps save our environment.

Hemlock woolly adelgids (HWAs) are an invasive insect that attack North American hemlock trees and pose a threat to our forests and parks. Master Gardener and Forest Owner Paula and our county's Natural Resource educator Sharon will be there to teach you how to identify this pest, and how we are working to save our Eastern Hemlock trees from HWA.

We will meet at the Mackinnon Lodge in Chestnut Ridge Park, hold a short indoor educational session about the hemlock woolly adelgid, and we will then hike around the area to look for signs of the hemlock woolly adelgid together.

December 2025 – Livestock Notes

I look forward to the coming year as we make some small changes within the programs to make the experience better. As I prepared this month's news, I can't help but remind myself of all the growth I have seen in each of our members. You all continue to amaze me with your skills and knowledge, but most of all your passion. I hope that you each realize that what you are doing now will carry you into your next chapters. 4-H gives you the opportunity to have experiences and to make mistakes so that you can learn. I hope that you will continue to try new things, maintain sportsmanship and keep show ethics and practices as a high priority. Let's see what 2026 will hold for you!

Buyers: Did you happen to share your gratitude with your buyer? Grab a holiday card and send it to them, start making connections for your 2026 projects.

Re-enrollment forms for the 2025-2026 program year were due on November 3 for all returning members. Did you miss the deadline? If so, please get your forms to the 4-H office with payment ASAP. There is information about public presentations, meetings and important updates that are coming and if you are not enrolled, you will not receive them. Do you have a friend that would like to join 4-H – they have until May 1 to get enrolled but sooner is always better than later.

Livestock Marketing Meetings will be held at the Ag Discovery Center at the Erie County Fairgrounds on the following dates: Marketing #1 – Wednesday, January 28, Marketing #2 – Tuesday, February 17, Marketing #3 – Monday, March 16 all from 6:30-8 p.m. Please know that we have a fresh and exciting program developed for our members who have participated in 3 or more auctions – rest assured you will not be hearing the same information. Our 1st and 2nd year members will continue to build the skills to solicit bidders, but we will also have a little spin on the presentation from last year. Remember if you are planning to sell at the auction you are required to attend 2 of the 3 (but all 3 would be great). Mark your calendar now to participate in the Bidder Dinner that will be held on Wednesday, April 15, 2026, at the Grange Building at the Erie County Fair. Participation in the dinner is required for all members selling in the auction. Do you have a conflict with a date? Email Tammi to let her know PRIOR to the meeting and you will be put on a make up list, make up sessions will be held via zoom, but you must be on the list before the meeting to qualify and to receive the zoom link.

Bidder Dinner Planning Committee: Your help is needed to make our Bidder Dinner successful; it takes many volunteers to help with the planning and on the day of the dinner. If you would like to help, please let Tammi know by emailing tlk6@cornell.edu. Let me know if you are willing to be on the planning committee, or if you are willing to help the day of the event (this would entail setting up, serving, cleaning up). These committees are open to both youth and adults.

Fair Book: I will keep you posted, but once the fair book is available online, I would encourage you all to take a look at it. There are some program changes (we will also discuss at orientations), but you should read the fair book, so you are in compliance with the rules and regulations and aware of all the classes that are being offered.

DUE DATE APPROACHING: Market Steer Registration Forms are due in the 4-H office by Monday, January 5 at 4:30 p.m. for all 2026 Market Steer Projects. Be sure to attach a copy of your BVD paper to the form and submit it together. Please do NOT email them. Drop in the mail or hand delivery to the office, there is a drop box outside our office door if you come before/after business hours.

Halter breaking: Have you been working on getting a halter on your steer projects, if not what are you waiting for? Remember to submit either your signed halter form or a video of you walking your steer on the rope and show halter, which demonstrates your ability to control the animal.

Market Heifers are now an option and will be shown in the non-sale market beef class only (market heifers may not be shown in the breeding class). Market Heifers are not eligible to be sold in the auction. We have also added to the prospect calf class, the option to show a prospect heifer (this heifer may not be shown in breeding class), you will have to choose where you want her shown. Note that steers and heifers will show together.

Dairy Cattle Orientation was held on Wednesday, December 3 we had a small group, but we reviewed the goals and objectives of the program and finished the evening by creating a marketing plan, designing an ice cream package, nutrition label, developed a cool name and made Ice Cream. Our senior group made "Triple M" ice cream with maple syrup and M&M's and our junior group made "The O.G. Ice Cream" and the variety was called "Cow Pies" with chocolate syrup and mini chocolate chips, with a gummy worm on the side.

Goat Orientation was held on a blustery, Wednesday, December 10 with some in person and some joined via zoom. We discussed the 2026 program and handed out the packets along with playing a short game of Kahoot. Goat Bowl will be hosted by Wyoming County 4-H in 2026, stay tuned for details, but it is never too early to begin studying.

Sheep and Swine – All too soon your producers will be very busy welcoming your 2026 projects into their barns. Now might be a good time to reach out to producers to share your interest in possibly purchasing animals. We do not have any meetings scheduled yet but remember that Livestock Marketing meetings are coming in January-March with the dinner in April. Public presentations are coming in February, start preparing now, so you have time to practice, practice, practice. There are many workshop opportunities that will help you with your presentation, check those out at the beginning of the news.

Poultry – Our 1st poultry meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 10 at 6:30 p.m. at the Power House, 39 S. Grove Street, East Aurora. We will take orders for the 2026 Market projects. I will communicate with you the cost of the chickens and turkeys in the January news.



Thank you to Sardinia Saddlers and Jennifer Barber for hosting our first clinic of the 2026 program year on November 15 with Larry Thurber. I heard it was a great day with a lot of participation. We hope that each member left that day with some knowledge and understanding of what a judge looks for when evaluating you at your shows.



During November 14-15, 2025, The Hillside Riders 4-H club took an overnight trip to Springfield, Massachusetts to attend the annual Equine Affair. The Equine Affair is a four-day equestrian expo at the Eastern State Exposition. They arrived on Friday night and quickly settled in before driving to Fantasia. Fantasia was a beautiful show to start their trip. Skilled horse riders danced with their horses to music in sync with their companions to create a rhythmic masterpiece. In a reenacted ancient battle scene stunt riders bravely rode towards each other prepared for battle. Acrobats balanced atop their steeds while performing excellent tricks while "equestrian vaulting". After getting a good night's sleep the Hillside Riders excitedly woke up and raced to the Expo. During the group's visit, they shopped for interesting and unique horse tack, grooming supplies, and equestrian apparel. Although each member spent a fair amount of time browsing through the shops, they still managed to attend many clinics where an expert could teach viewers a specific horse-related subject. The Hillside Riders watched a few clinics as a group. One clinic they watched was for barrel racing where they learned to quickly accelerate and control their horses during western games, events where riders complete a pattern as quickly as they can with sharp turns and quick stops. In addition, they all watched a liberty training clinic. During this clinic an expert showed how you can control your horse and form a strong bond through small signals. While liberty training you can teach your horse groundwork and can even take your horse through maneuvers without a lead rope. These were only two of the many clinics that the Hillside Riders visited. Many clinics were about training your horse to become more advanced while others had horse ownership or even showcases of specific horse breeds. All in all, each and every 4-H member had an amazing experience that will not be easily forgotten.

Calling all youth who would like to participate in a Digital Pen Pal Experience.

In 2025 we began a program where we linked 4-H members who live in rural Erie County with youth that live in urban Erie County. Youth interacted by sharing answers to the topic questions through Instagram or text (regulated by our educators) and learned many different things that brought a lot of awareness of similarities and differences in each of their communities. The youth then experienced a day at the fair and met in person, while eating lunch, then took a tour of the livestock area and participated in a mock dairy show.

We are currently looking for 4-H members from rural and suburban areas who are interested in sharing your daily life experience with youth from our urban program. Youth who have participated are planning to do so again, but we have had many urban youth now express interest to participate.
