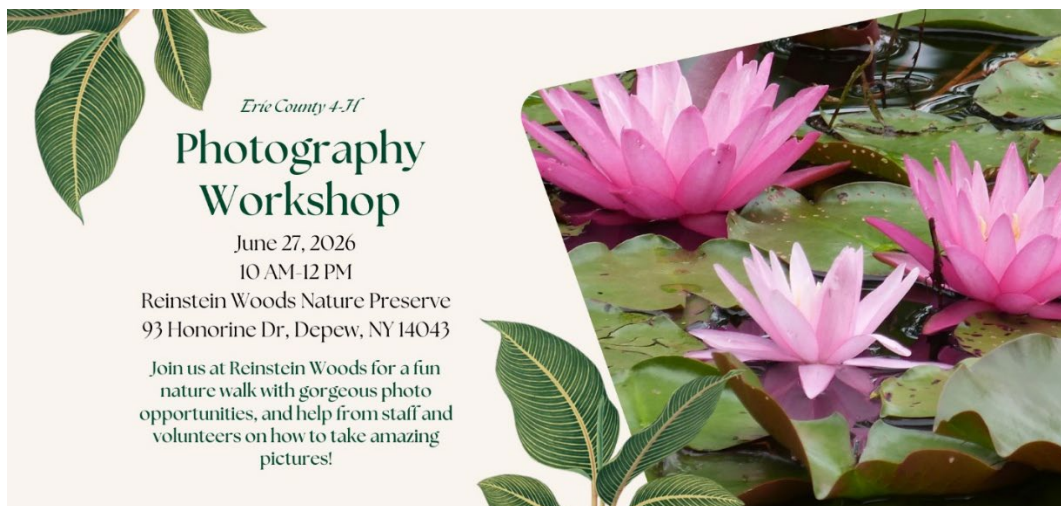

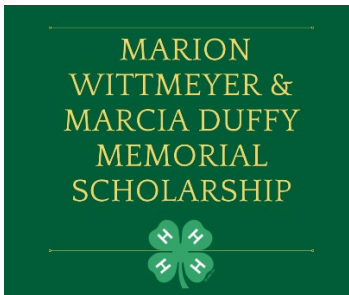
During our walk, the water lilies will be in bloom- they bloom starting around 9 AM. You are encouraged to take pictures of one of the highlights at Reinstein Woods.

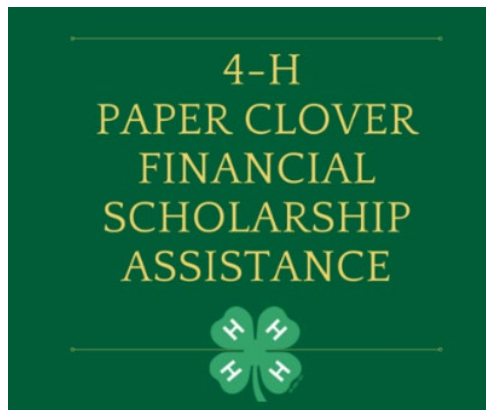

2026 ERIE COUNTY FAIR – 4-H Entries

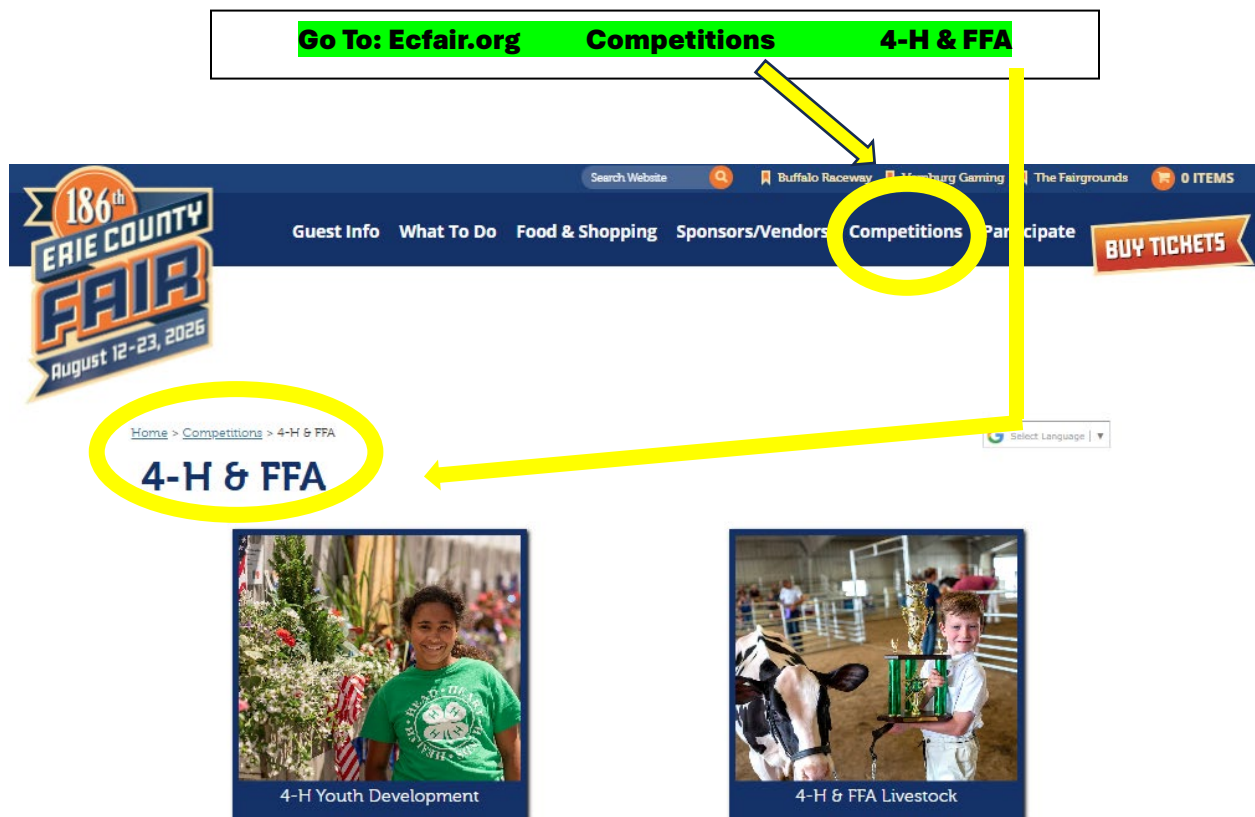
Thanks to the efforts of our 4-H staff, volunteer project superintendents, and the friendly staff at the Erie County Agricultural Society, we are happy to inform our 4-H families and volunteers that the 2026 Erie County Fair premium books are available to the public on the Erie County Fair website.

For those new to the program, premium books are our guides for 4-Hers on how they can enter their projects completed during the program year as exhibits for the public to see at the Erie County Fair. For each exhibit you enter, you can earn a **ribbon and premium monies**. On top of that, you have the opportunity to earn free Erie County Fair tickets, additional awards, and most importantly, show your friends and family the amazing things you've done in Erie County 4-H.

The website for entering exhibits will open in April 2026; we encourage you to read through the premium books and use them to help plan your fair entries, or use the project classes as inspiration to take on new projects in the next few months. Anything you do- community service, science projects, crafts and recipes- can be a fair project. The sky is the limit!

We have almost 1,000 birds arriving and I will not be responsible for them for the entire day. My suggestion is to have someone on stand by for Tuesday-Thursday that you can call when you get the message.

Last Poultry meeting: Our last poultry meeting for the year will be held on June 2 at 6:30 p.m. at our Burton Road property. Our speaker will be Chuck Susik and he will talk with you all about showmanship (both market and production) and how to prepare. We will also have a discussion on how to select that perfect pair of meat chickens and the perfect turkey. We will also, get updates from our 4-H members who are doing the Mystery Chick program.

The Erie County Crafters also had a very successful bake sale at the Lancaster Public Library on April 25, 2026.

Over \$200 was raised by selling various goodies to the patrons and staff!



At the meeting, in groups of 3-4, club members went to four different tables learning about different bird-related topics: Birds in Art, Feathers, Bird Homes, and Bird Food. Then, they had a snack break and a mystery guest! Messinger Woods Wildlife Care & Education Center came to show and tell the club members about four different animals they brought with them. They brought an Eastern Screech Owl that has a permanently broken wing because their bones heal very fast, and it had started to heal that way by the time it was found. Then they brought out a Barred Owl that is mostly blind from a head injury! There was also a crow called Jimini Crowket, who imprinted on humans who found him as a fledgling and can talk, and check out his public speaking skills on this video:

<https://youtube.com/@talkingcrow8096?si=JYeNDWwVaTUSNUxT>. We learned that if a crow's eyes are blue, then they are fledglings. Don't try to help fledglings in any way if you find one with blue eyes on the ground. Its parents are there to help. Finally, they brought in an opossum with a neurological injury that has been tamed by humans, but it hadn't imprinted on humans.
