
4-H Fair Entries – Step by Step Guide:

1. Go to ecfair.org (for Fairbook) – Select Competitions




- 2. On the Competitions page scroll down to where you see either, 4-H Livestock or 4-HYouth Development select the fair book category that you are interested in.
- 3. Selecting either 4-H Livestock or 4-H Youth Development will take you to the "How Do I Enter" pages for the Fairbook categories scroll to the bottom of the "How Do I Enter" pages. Looking at the Entry Information will help you decide what category an animal or item needs to be entered into.












4. Once you have looked at the Entry/Fairbook Information you are ready to go to the 4-H Online Entry Site. You may either do that by going directly ecfairwire.com or from the link posted on the Fair site (listed as To enter 4-H or FFA -https://ecfairwire.com/)or CCE/4-H Website.

Please note: There is no charge for 4-H entries....if you go to check out and there is a charge listed...you may not be on the 4-H On-Line Entry site.

This year, the Talent and Fashion Show will again be held inside the 4-H Youth Development Building. It's also more of a "showcase," as there are no judges/winners. Depending on the amount of participants registered, the Chef Challenge will either be done individually or in pairs/teams.

4-Hers of all ages can sign up for these events. For the Chef Challenge, there will be a separate challenge for those who are not old enough to use hot tools (in accordance with NYS 4-H guidelines).

Opportunities for youth to participate in the fair at the 4-H Youth Development Building!

Read below to see all of the exciting ways that 4-Hers can be involved and play a role at the 4-H YDB during the Erie County Fair. Registering for these events is a 2-step process (doesn't matter what order they are done in):

- 1) Use the link below to pick a date(s) and time(s) to participate in the activity. This must be done before the fair (before August 3rd)
- 2) Visit https://ecfaircce.fairwire.com/ and sign-up for the activity under the Public Interaction section. This must be done by July 8th and is necessary so that the 4-Her receives a premium.

4-H Alive (1 hour)- Share your favorite project with fair-goers and answer any questions they may have. This should be a demonstration of how to make or do this project. https://signup.com/go/WLsKmNm

4-H Alive (2 hours)- Share your favorite project with fair-goers and answer any questions they may have. This should be a demonstration of how to make or do this project. https://signup.com/go/PfJaCYt

Hands-on Activities- Come practice your leadership skills by instructing a hands-on activity. No food-based activities. An example of an activity could be a takeaway craft. Youth under 12 are encouraged to invite an adult (parent/leader) to assist them in this activity. https://signup.com/go/RkdEQqb

4-H Ambassador- Share the 4-H experience with visitors in the Youth Development Building! This may involve answering questions, showing off projects, and talking about your 4-H experience. Ambassadors will be trained before their shift. https://signup.com/go/AgFsuNB

Mannequin Modeling- 4-H members can show off their textile projects by posing or walking around the Youth Development Building. https://signup.com/go/tEXEwph

Public Presentation- This is the time to follow your evaluators' advice and share your presentation at the fair! This is a great opportunity to present to a wider audience about your chosen topic. https://signup.com/go/sXhtJAA

The 4-H Café is a volunteer opportunity for youth and adults!

4-H Café- Volunteering at the Café is a great opportunity to practice customer interaction and food service skills. 3 youth and 1 adult are needed per shift. https://signup.com/go/WAuXGvs

4-H Livestock Notes – June 2024

Are you continuing your marketing strategy? Your marketing of your project did not end with the bidder dinner – you should be soliciting more bidders to support you and your project – but most importantly – continue to visit with those bidders who have expressed interest in supporting you. By now each of you should be sending out your letters and following them up with a phone call or personal visit. Bidder packets will be coming to you the beginning of July. Watch your email inbox for little reminders and helpful tips for your marketing strategy.

What are the key points to writing a good bidder letter?

- 1. Use the correct name and address for your bidder
- 2. Use a respectful, personalized greeting Dear Mr. Smith,
- 3. The first paragraph should have an introduction of yourself along with an invitation to attend the auction.
- 4. The second paragraph should have some background on you and your animal, how you take care of it, and what you plan on doing with the money. Hint: Include an interesting, personal or memorable story!
- 5. The third and last paragraph should contain the details of the sale, thank them for their support, let them know you will follow up and how you plan to do that.
- 6. Close your letter with a Sincerely, Best Regards and your name.
- 7. Remember, if your handwriting is not neat, it is ok to type your letter, BUT make sure you hand sign it.
- 8. Be sure that you proofread your letter and check for spelling and grammar errors!
- 9. Include a picture of you with your project (nicely dressed).
- 10. When you personally visit your bidder, DRESS NICELY and bring something to give them (a picture of you and your project, your bidder brochure, etc.)

Sending a lot of letters sounds great, but postage is expensive, be thoughtful in who you solicit – remember it is not about how many letters you send, it is about inviting bidders that will support you.

How to Address an Envelope:



Livestock Interviews – Livestock interviews are coming in the month of July. Please select one of the dates to complete your interview – it is a requirement to be eligible to show and sell at the fair. I will be sending you the potential questions and more information for each species you are showing so you can prepare. Remember we will also have a quick activity for you while you are waiting pertaining to your marketing of your projects.

Interview dates are **Monday, July 1, Tuesday, July 9, Thursday, July 18 and Wednesday, July 31.** I will send you an email with your scheduled time for your interview. They will run from 6-8 pm on each of the dates.

Entries are due by Monday, July 8, the link will expire at 11:59 p.m. Please be sure to do your entries.

Health Papers: Schedule your veterinary visit now. Remember there is a 21-day withholding period on the rabies vaccine for beef, dairy, sheep, goats. Cattle that receive the shipping fever vaccination also have a withholding period of 21 days, be sure to meet all withholding periods for your market animals. All cattle and hogs should have an RFID tag, cattle may have a metal 21 tag instead. I have RFID tags available in the office or your veterinarian should have some as well.

Ear Tags: If your animal loses an ear tag that you used to register your animal as your project, remember to contact Tammi and to submit a photo and updated paperwork with the new number. If your health paper was also issued, you will need to have the veterinarian update that as well.

Livestock T-shirts – Would you like to design the 2024 Erie County 4-H fair livestock t-shirt? Please send your design to tlk6@cornell.edu by Monday, July 8 for consideration. Designs may be computer generated or hand designed. It should be 8.5 x 11 inches. If you hand design something, please be sure the lines are dark and there are no smudges. Computer generated – be sure to not use copyrighted material. Call if you have questions.

Beef: We will be having a Beef Fitting and Showing refresher meeting in July, we are currently setting the date. It is highly recommended for 1st and 2nd year participants to plan on attending as we will be covering items that will get you ready for the fair. Watch your email and the next news for the date.

Swine: We will be holding a zoom meeting to cover showmanship, fitting and fair preparation of your market hogs on Wednesday, June 26 at 6 p.m. The zoom link will be sent to all registered swine participants the week before. This will be a great meeting for those that are new to the program as we will be discussing the basics and have opportunity for you to ask questions.

Sheep: Sheep Fitting & Showing meeting on Tuesday, July 2 at 6:30 p.m. at the Vergien's, 5652 Hunters Creek Rd., South Wales, NY 14139. We will focus on fitting and showmanship along with fair preparation. Please do not bring any animals to this meeting.

Poultry: Market chickens will be shipped on Wednesday, June 12, arrival should be Thursday, June 13. Watch for a text message with updates.

Our next **poultry meeting** will take place on Tuesday, June 18 with Herman Weber as our guest speaker talking about proper handling of your market birds to prevent bruising.

The **market poultry** show is scheduled for Sunday, July 28 at 4 p.m. at the Blair Farm. Mark your calendar to participate to be eligible to sell at the fair.

Pullorum Testing: Are you planning to show poultry at the fair? If so, your birds need to be pullorum tested. NYS Ag and Markets will be at CCE – Erie on Monday, June 24 from 4-6 pm conducting the free test. All chickens over 4 months of age along with other birds (except waterfowl) need to be tested. Contact Tammi at tlk6@cornell.edu to register.

Llama/Alpaca: Things are quiet in the llama/alpaca program right now; we will hold a meeting in July, watch your email for details.

Goat Fitting & Showing: Mark your calendar for our Goat Fitting & Showing meeting for Thursday, June 27 at 6:30 p.m. at the farm of A. Hayne/C. Saraceni in Alexander. We will be discussing all 3 goat programs and get you prepared for a successful day in the showring. Stay tuned for more details as we get closer to June. Remember, we will be holding our knowledge contest/skillathon at this meeting – this means extra project points!


