Come learn about the art and science of cheesemaking. We will be making fresh mozzarella cheese. 😊



#### **October 2023 Livestock Notes**

It's a new project year. I know our beef members are currently seeking out their 2024 steer projects and many have already participated in a show. There are many opportunities to educate yourself about the species you are interested in showing. We are lucky to have some great show opportunities outside of the fair in our backyard. I hope you will search them out and challenge yourself to go and learn and grow with the opportunities. I am beginning to work on some exciting meeting topics for the coming year. One thing we will be focusing on is bidder solicitation. As our program continues to grow, we also need to grow our bidder base and we will be working with you to give you the tools to do this. I am also going to plan a bus trip that will focus on careers in agriculture. We will visit some businesses and take some exciting tours; it will be a day filled with adventure and fun. I look forward to this coming year, as I am eager to meet our new members and to continue to watch our current members grow and accomplish your goals.

**2024 Enrollment:** We have now entered the 2023/24 4-H program year, this means that you need to get your 2024 enrollment forms back to the 4-H office as soon as possible so you can participate in meetings and continue to receive our Speed Read. Please be sure to submit your re-enrollment paperwork no later than November 3, 2023, so you can participate in the 2024 fair.

**Market Checks:** Market checks went out at the end of September, you all should have received them, please be prompt in cashing them so they do not get lost. Along with your check you should have found a breakdown of your check along with the name and address of your buyer(s). We are aware that some addresses were incorrect, if you need help, please contact me and I will assist with getting the correct information for you. Please be sure to send a thank you note to those that supported you and your project. Remember once is never enough – remember your buyer during the holidays as well.

**Trophy Sponsorship**: Along with your market check you also received a sticker with the name and address of an award sponsor. I ask that you send a note thanking them for their support to the program – even if you did not receive an award – you all received a t-shirt and that required sponsorship. We had many awards that did not have a sponsor name, but businesses contributed money which made all the awards possible. Please take the 2 minutes to write a nice note, our supporters would like to know they are appreciated. If by chance you received a trophy there should be the name and address of that sponsor, send them a note please. If by chance there was no sticker on the bottom, please contact me so I can give you the address.

**Something new for 2024:** In an effort to help promote and increase support for the market auction you will see in the coming months some new opportunities. Coming in January and February will be meetings that focus on soliciting bidders – all the how too's and timelines. Then sometime in the months of April/May we are planning to do a Bidders Appreciation event. This event will be an opportunity for bidders you have solicited to come and enjoy a dinner with our members, interact and gain a better understanding of how their support impacts our members and a time for members to share your knowledge. We will be looking for parents and youth to help in making this event successful. If you are interested in being a part of planning and implementing this event, please let Tammi know.

I am currently working with all our livestock advisory committee's meeting with each one to discuss the 2023 fair and to plan the 2024 programs. If you were either a Master Showman of a species, or placed in the top 4, watch for an invitation to attend a committee meeting as you are the representative for your fellow members.

**Public Presentations:** Yep, I said it, start to think now about a potential topic. We will hold our Public Presentation event in February. Check out the beginning of this newsletter for details on the Kickoff on December 5<sup>th</sup>. You are invited to come and learn the "how to" of giving a presentation from topic selection to the do's and don'ts.

**2024 Erie County Fair Schedule:** I am currently working with the fair to get the 2024 schedule completed so it can be publicized at the beginning of November so parents can request time off. The schedule is very complicated and yes, there are some changes being made. I will share it with you as soon as I have it.

**Beef:** We will be holding our 2024 Beef Orientation on Monday, November 27 at 7:00 p.m. at the Powerhouse (the building next door to our 4-H office where we have been holding meetings). We will be discussing the program year and something fun. Beef halters are in my office, please stop to pick it up. I will also have them at orientation.

Market participants in the Sheep, Swine, Poultry, Rabbit, and Goat programs, please watch for meetings coming in January – April that will focus on soliciting bidders. I know many of you do not begin to think about your projects until March, but a lot will be happening in the program much earlier in 2024 and your participation will be an asset to your projects.

**Swine members:** We are selling the automatic water system. We are offering the "T's" to our 4-H members first. The cost will be \$10.00 per T. If you would like to purchase one or a few to help with the watering of your market projects, please contact Tammi at <u>tlk6@cornell.edu</u> the week of October 29 – November 3 to place your order. Payment must be made to the 4-H office before you will be able to pick up your purchase. Any T's not spoken for by November 3 will be sent to auction. The funds from the sale of the system will be put back into the swine account. Note: there will be no hose accompanying the T's as it has become too brittle over the years.

**Dairy & Working Goat, Llama/Alpaca:** We will be kicking off the 2024 program year in January with our orientations. Watch the Speed Read for more details in the coming month.

**Dog Program:** We are excited that our 2 county dog clubs are accepting new members. Jake was a member of the Empire Paint Horse Assoc team, placing 1<sup>st</sup> out of 15 teams. Julia and Lucas were on the NYS 4-H Team, placing 5<sup>th</sup> out of 15. Individually, Jake placed 3<sup>rd</sup> out of 58, Julia 35<sup>th</sup> out of 58 and Lucas 19<sup>th</sup> out of 58.
